Technology

Augmentative Communication

- AAC comes in 2 forms unaided, sign language, and aided = devices.
- Both can be used in conjunction with each other.
- With AAC devices symbols are heavily used.
- Children with Autism are found to have strong visual processing skills, and low expressive communication. This makes them good candidates for AAC devices.



Tablets Personal or ?

- When economically possible a communication Tablet/iPad should never be the same device as the one they play on.
- Communication device should be visually distinct. Use color coded cases.
- Communication device should only have their Communication app loaded on it.
- Make use of such functions as Guided Access to Lock their Communication App into place.
- Always have a form of backup running on their device such as iCloud or Dropbox.



Android AAC

- Amazon's Fire tablets are android devices.
- Android has a large Market place of Apps through the Google Play store.
- Unfortunately none of the big name in AAC apps such as Touch Chat or Proloquo2Go are available for Android devices.
- Dynavox T10 is an android based tablet with their Tobii software loaded on to it.



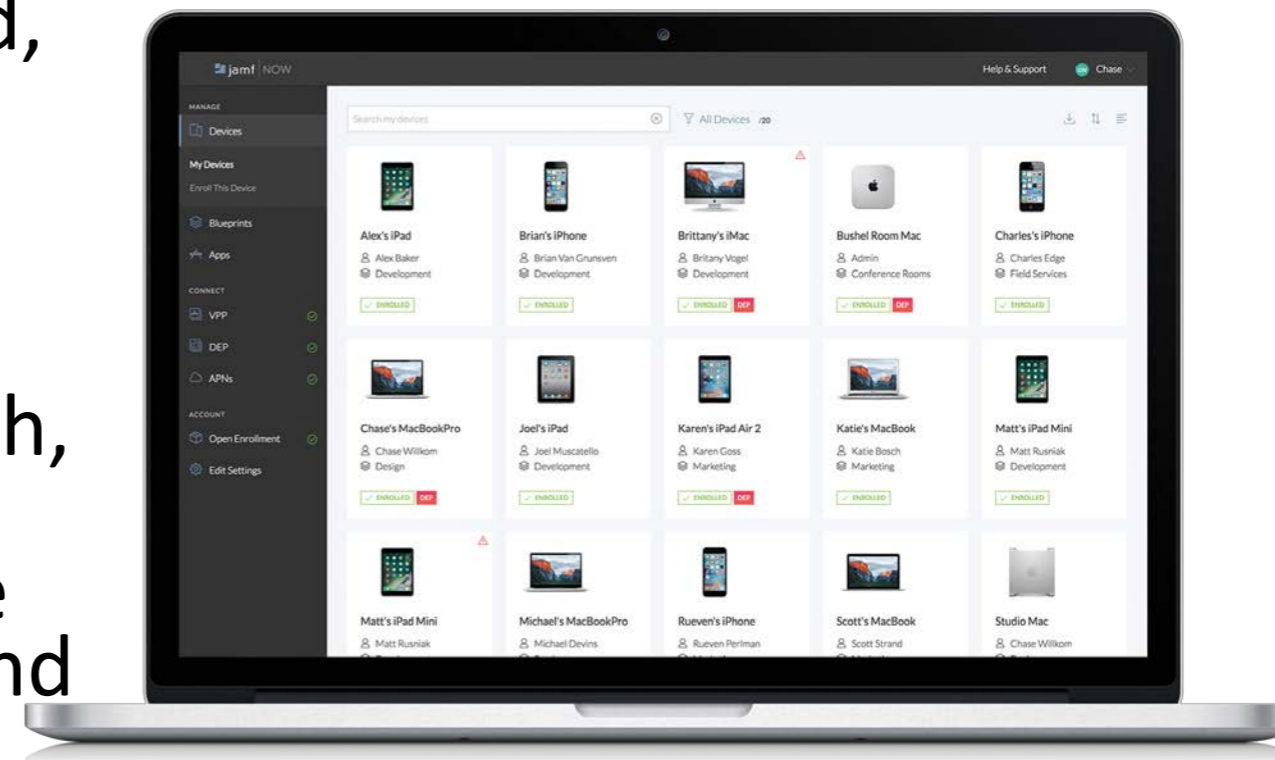
Apple iPad

- At Monarch Center we use approximately 150 iPads.
- The iPads are assigned to Teams, SLPs, Behaviorists, OT's, and students directly.
- We use a mix of different versions of iPads.
- iPads have been a great boon to our schools educational resources as it allows us to be more mobile with our teaching.
- They serve as a wide variety of uses such as educational apps for the student's, reinforcers, visuals such as schedules and token boards, data collection, photography and video capturing, and much more.



MDM - JAMF

- An MDM (Mobile Device Management) allows you to manage many iPads through one interface.
- They allow you to set policies, add restrictions, deploy apps, update the devices, keep them organized, and find lost or stolen iPads.
- At Monarch Center we use JAMF for our MDM solution.
- There are many different MDM's Jamf, Meraki, Maas360, AirWatch, and many more.
- Selecting one is about finding the compromise between features and cost.
- For schools I have Found JAMF to be the best all around solution.

- Great for bathrooms and even desks.





Smart Home Technology Helps Keep Children With Autism Safe And Secure

One in 68 children are now diagnosed with autism spectrum disorder. It's common for children with autism to wander – smart home technology offers their families peace of mind.



Sensors monitor home entry and exit points and alert parents when a child starts to wander.

Outdoor cameras share video clips to help parents search in the right direction when a child has wandered.

Smart thermostats save money by reducing energy use.

A smart doorbell lets parents see and speak with visitors via smart phone, minimizing interruptions to routines or therapy.

Indoor cameras deliver live HD video remotely, allowing parents to monitor children from a distance.

49% of children with autism wander from safety. 43% of their parents report losing sleep fearing their child will wander at night.

53% of children with autism wander long enough to cause significant worry.

65% of wandering incidents involve a close call with traffic.

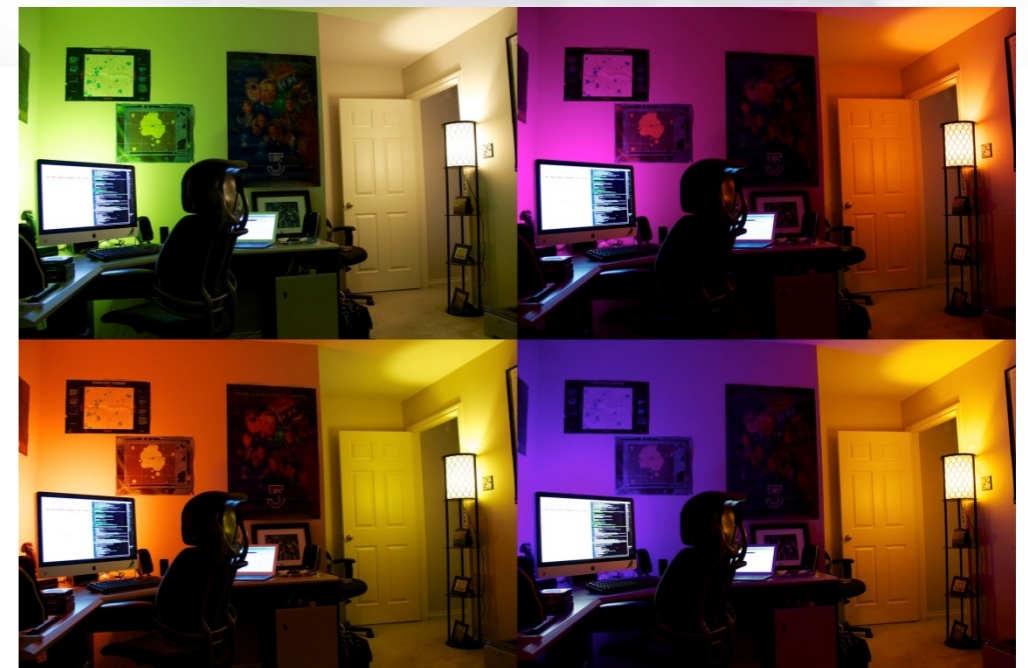
- A 2012 [study](#)* found that 49% of all children with autism attempt to wander or bolt from a safe, supervised place.
- Smart things sensors allow you to place sensors on your doors, windows, and even cabinets.
- There are even motion sensors.
- It can then activate services or notify of these events.
- Works with IFTTT

Phillips Hue

- Hues are smart light bulbs.
- They can be used to change the color of a whole room.
- If prompting an individual on the spectrum sometimes it is difficult to direct their attention to the prompt.
- Hues paired with IFTTT can create schedules in which this smart device can change colors at a particular time or when an event happens.
- Example: Shower time - the light in the family room turns Blue to prompt.
- Outside Door opens at a time outside of the usual parameters – the bulbs all turn red to alert you.

Wearables & Autism

- Wearable technology is a booming trend.
- For children with Autism they stand heavily benefit from this technology, as it can help them adapt to their everyday life.
- From a research structure wearables allow us to track and gain more information about the relationship between environmental factors and the student's reaction to them.



Apple Watch – Autism

- The watch has the ability to connect with your iPhone and share data from apps.
- Native Apps can now run on the watch independent of phone.
- On the new Apple Watch Series 3 - the device can run independently without it's paired phone.
- Using features such as Messages you could prompt a student in a more socially appropriate way.
- Monarch is currently in a testing phase using Apple Watches in the classroom.
- There is the potential for multiple prompt types physical (through vibration), visual (through images or messages), verbal /audio (from built in speakers)
- The Apple Watch has built in sensors to monitor things such as heart rate. These sensors could allow for additional data to be tracked on a Student with ASD.

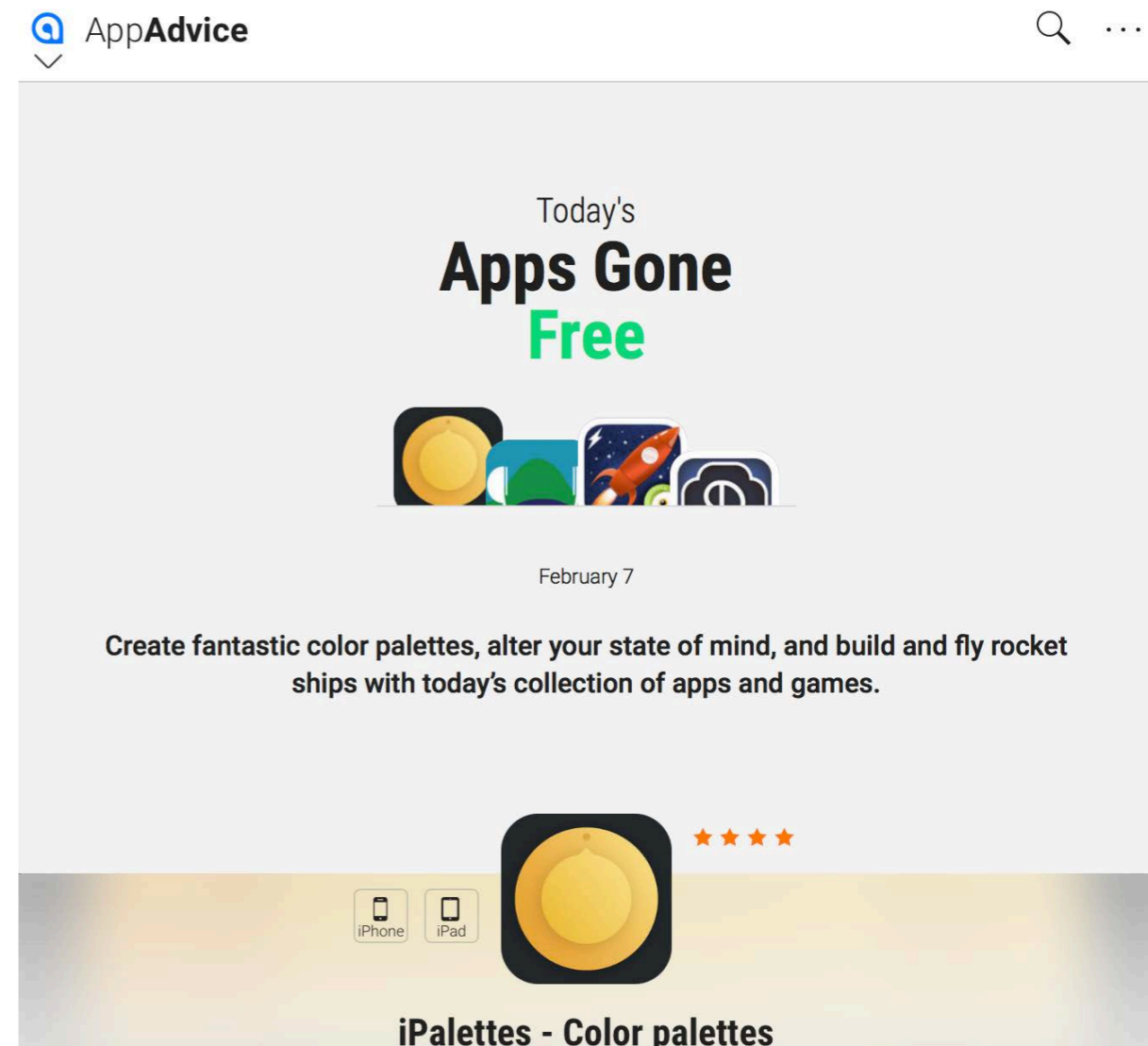

- A simple example of this would be when snow is in the forecast send me an email with the weather for tomorrow.
- A complex version can be set using other devices like when I come home turn on all the lights and play some music.
- For anyone using Amazon Echo's this is an awesome pairing.
- Can be used for kids on the spectrum to teach rudimentary programming skills, and cause and effect.

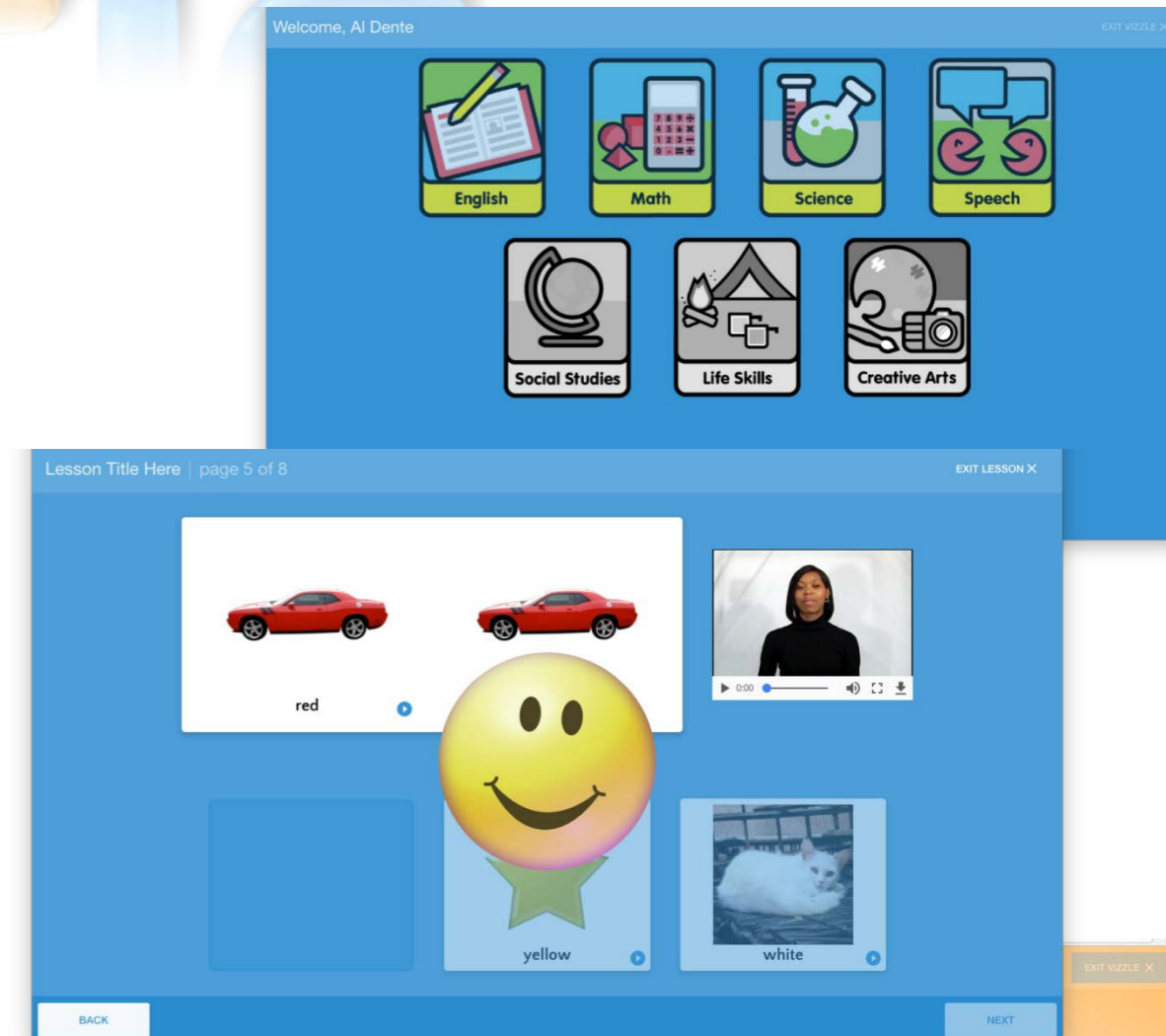
- Boardmaker is software made by Tobii Dynavox Company, formerly Mayer Johnson - which allows users to create visuals.
- Huge library of visuals, hand-drawn images, and ability to add your own images.
- Con: Boardmaker is expensive \$399, it requires the CD to be in the computer on each use.
- If your CD breaks you have to pay to get a new one.



- Create activities online and print them or assign to your students.
- Student Center iPad app available in the app store.
- Track the results of student work against IEP goals or educational standards. Track staff and student usage.
- Board Maker Community to share you creations.

vizzle

- VizZle is an online subscription based software for teaching children with Autism.
- VizZle has multiple tools for teaching included through stories, games, matching exercises, sequencing, sorting and the ability to create visuals and schedules.
- VizZle has a lesson library of over 13,500 activities created and shared by teachers and therapists.
- It automatically collects data on a student's progress to log against IEP goals and objectives.
- Using the VizZle Player app versions of which play on computers and many mobile devices.
- A new version of VizZle completely rewritten from the ground up is coming out at the end of march.

iOS 11 and Apps

- This past fall Apple released iOS 11. In this version of the OS it no longer supported 32-bit apps.
- 32 bit apps were older apps, many written when the first iPhones and iPads came out and then no longer updated.
- The lack of updates over the years rendered many apps useless.
- Many apps on previous Autism lists are no longer functional.



Visual Planner

- By Good Karma Applications
- Able to create daily, weekly, and monthly schedules.
- Able to set items with multiple occurrences.
- Ability to create “Activity Schedules”, these work like micro schedules. Checklists are built into the Activity Schedules.
- Can use videos in schedule, but cannot use video and activity schedule at the same time.
- The ability to back up your schedules to your computer.
- The ability to restrict editing, clock, libraries, notes, and activity schedules.

Emerging Technologies

WebMoti

- Telepresence hardware and software which allows students who are on the autism spectrum participate in the classroom without the over stimulation of being in the classroom.
- Through this interface the student can manage the sensory input of the classroom from a remote setting.
- Combination of camera system and a specialized chair that allows for tactile input through vibrations.
- Currently in testing in the testing phase for Toronto District School Board.



Virtual Reality

- Virtual Reality is defined as “the computer-generated simulation of a three-dimensional image or environment that can be interacted with in a seemingly real or physical way by a person using special electronic equipment, such as a helmet with a screen inside or gloves fitted with sensors.”
- This technology is proliferating over the last few years due to a growth in processing power that allows for rendering of real life images and high definition environments.



Virtual Autism Experience

- The National Autistic Society has released a VR experience of what it is like to be an individual with Autism. The VR experience is from the perspective a boy and while he is waiting for his mom to take money out of a ATM. In this experience you will hear the sounds and see situations that are amplified by Autism.

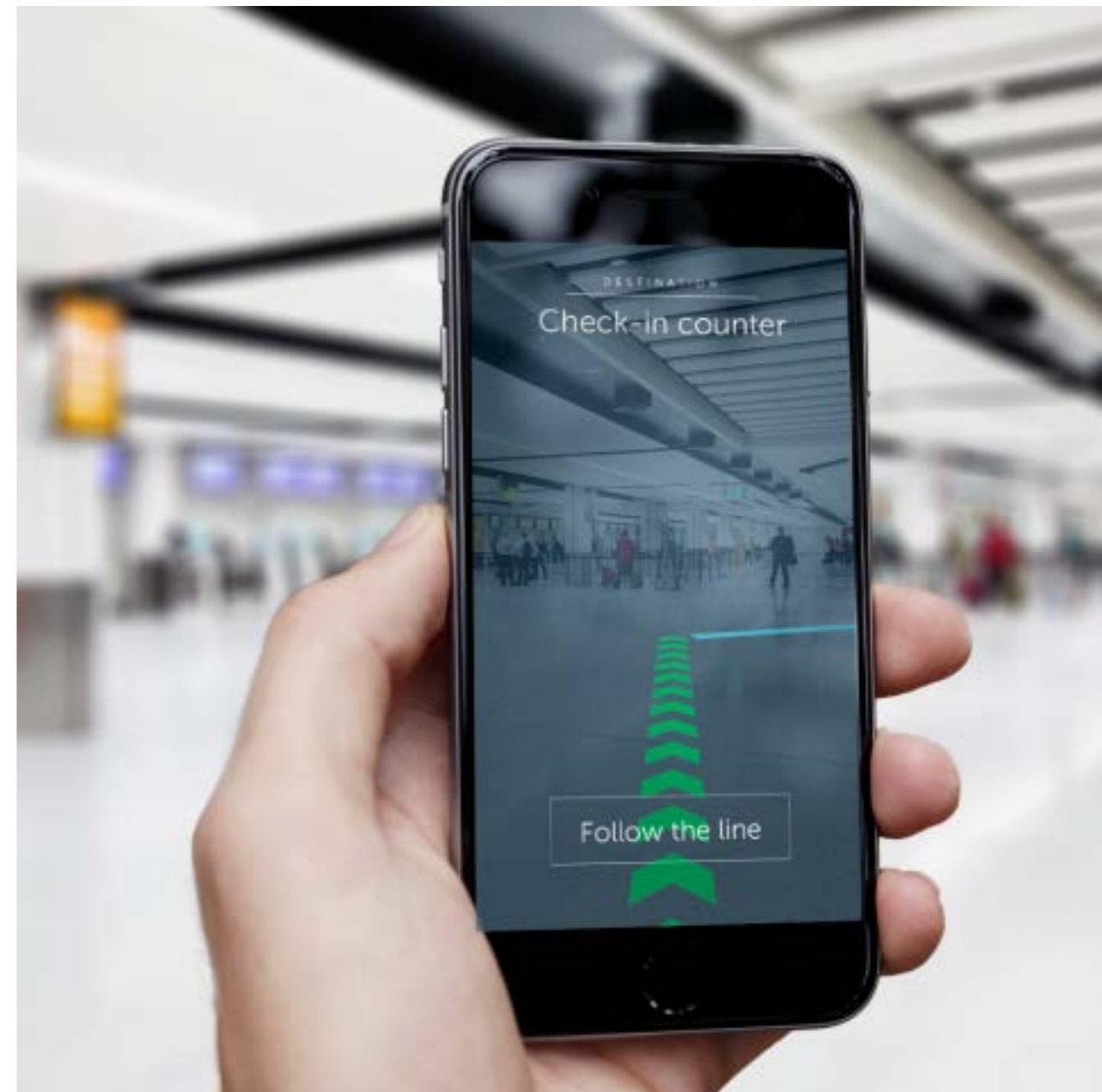
Vita DMF

- The USC Institute for Creative Technologies and Dan Marino Foundation have partnered on technology to improve social skills. The fruits of their labor is Vita DMF.
- This Virtual reality experience creates real world job interviews for individuals with ASD.
- These lessons can help an individual prepare for the work force and gain their confidence as they prepare for the interview process.



Augmented Reality

- Augmented reality is defined as “technology that superimposes a computer-generated image on a user's view of the real world, thus providing a composite view.”
- For the everyday person think of this technology as an overlay to the world around you, that you can interact with.
- For Individuals with ASD this technology could help ease their interaction with the environment and provide them important contextual information.
- The boon to this technology is that it is manipulating the real world.



Intel Vaunt

- Announced February 5th
- Vaunt is Intel's attempt into the smart glasses industry and to learn where Google Glass failed.
- "There is no camera to creep people out, no button to push, no gesture area to swipe, no glowing LCD screen, no weird arm floating in front of the lens, no speaker, and no microphone (for now)." - The Verge.
- Vaunt is attempting to learn from google glasses mistakes which inevitably - put the project on hold.
- Any smart AR device has the ability to profoundly change the lives of individuals with Autism.



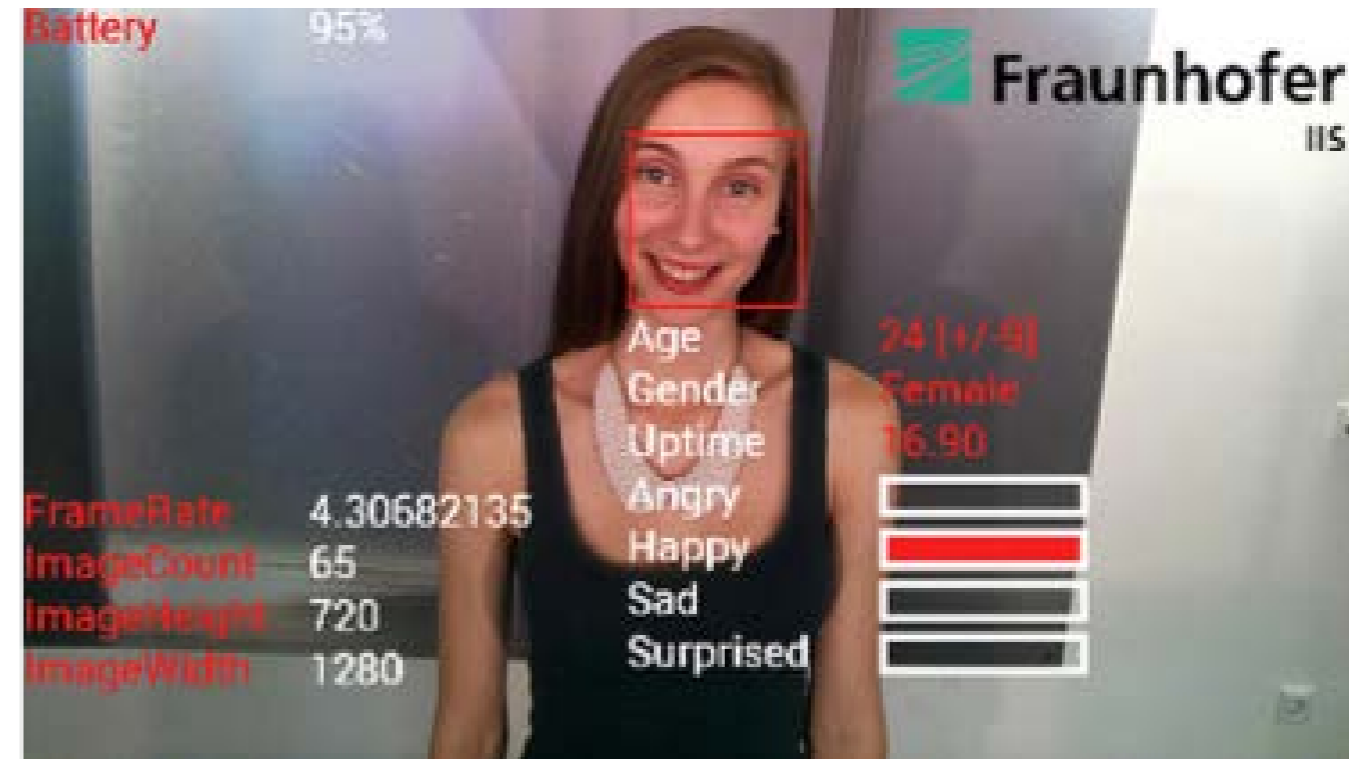
Microsoft HoloLens

- HoloLens is a set of smart glasses, that allows the user to see “Holographic” interfaces in their surroundings.
- An example of this would be that you could walk up to your fridge, and see an interface projected onto the fridge that acts as an order form for an online grocery store.
- This is similar to Google Glass
- HoloLens was demoed at the Windows 10 announcement, and was said to be released in the lifespan of Windows 10.



Detecting Emotions

- The Fraunhofer Institute for Integrated Circuits (Fraunhofer IIS) has been working on an image analysis system for many years. It allows them to detect age, gender and emotion.
- When a person is experiencing feelings they are often conveyed through facial expressions and body language.
- Using the built in camera and facial recognition the device can tell them the emotions the person is most likely feeling.



Brain Power

- A startup that is using Google Glass to allow the user to see symbols of the a persons emotions.
- It then rewards them points based on if they chose the right emotion correctly.
- It is important to note that GOOGLE stopped development on Google Glass.
- Models previously produced can still be found on eBay.

Making Sense of Symbols

- AR devices could help a person make sense of more items in their surrounding.
- Deciphering complex symbols like street signs.
- If the individual is unable to read a device might be able to alert the user by speaking the message, providing a visual sign they understand and more.
